NEA ARRA Grants to Local Regrantors, FY 2009

Funds for local subgranting are provided to local arts agencies designated to operate on behalf of their local governments or as operating units of city or county government. Up to \$50,000 of the award may be used for their own jobs and/or the administration of subgranting programs. The rest must be regranted to nonprofit arts organizations.
