Organization Mission Statement

The Delaware Division of the Arts is a state agency dedicated to nurturing and supporting the arts to enhance the quality of life for all Delawareans.

Arts Education Mission Statement

The Delaware Division of the Arts is committed to the advancement of learning in the arts for Delawareans of all ages. The Division supports the design and implementation of programs that foster learning in the arts, evaluates the current programs for schools and arts organizations, and adapts funding and technical assistance initiatives to meet the needs of arts education providers. Its goal is to facilitate the development of arts programming, consistent with state arts standards, as an integral part of children's learning, consistent with National Endowment for the Arts goal of ensuring that the arts are basic in the education of children and young adults.

Arts Education Program Overview

The Delaware Division of the Arts supports the design and implementation of programming that fosters learning in the arts, evaluates the current programs for school and arts organizations, and adapts funding and professional development initiatives to meet the needs of arts education providers.

The Division's arts education grants provide funding for the implementation of standards based arts curriculum and programming developed by collaborations among members of the arts and education communities. These programs serve youth in a variety of settings, including a self-contained classroom of special needs students with severe physical disabilities. The Division requires that recipients demonstrate a sequential standards based arts curriculum, based on Delaware's State Standards for the Visual and Performing Arts, and dedicated staff within the school to sustain meaningful arts education as a routine component of each child's education.

Grant Programs

Types of Arts Education Grant Programs

- residency program
- other: The Division offers Education Resource Grants. The goals for these grants are to strengthen school based arts education projects, programs, and activities that utilize the

arts education resources of the Delaware arts community, and to increase and enhance professional development opportunities for artists and teachers seeking to further their knowledge and expertise in arts education. Arts organizations and schools are eligible to apply for Education Resource Grants.

Artist Residency Program

Artist Residency Program is administered by the state arts agency office.

Fee Structure for Teaching Artists

- \$250 per day
- There can be additional compensation outside of the fee structure. Additional funding for the teaching artist can be obtained from the school, parent-teacher association units, or outside community grants or sponsorships.

Additional Comments on Residency Program

Teaching artists are compensated up to 75% of their fee, not to exceed \$250 per day.
Artist groups are compensated up to 75% of their fee, not to exceed \$350 per day.
Schools are expected to fund the remaining 25% of the cost to bring the artist(s) to the school.

Teaching Artist Roster Program

Comments on Teaching Artist Roster

The artist roster in Delaware is comprehensive and does not list artists solely available to teach in the schools. Instead, the artist roster lists all interested visual and performing artists in Delaware who are interested in being on the roster, they select whether they are available for exhibits, performances, school residencies, and the like, and the roster lists their project or hourly fees.

Professional Development Services

Provision of Professional Development Trainings, Workshops and/or Institutes

- For arts specialists, professional development is administered by the state arts agency office.
- For teaching artists, professional development is administered by the state arts agency office. When opportunities present themselves, the Division offers funding for teaching artists to take advantage of available workshops aimed at expanding knowledge.
- The Division partners with the Department of Education's professional development initiatives for arts educators.
