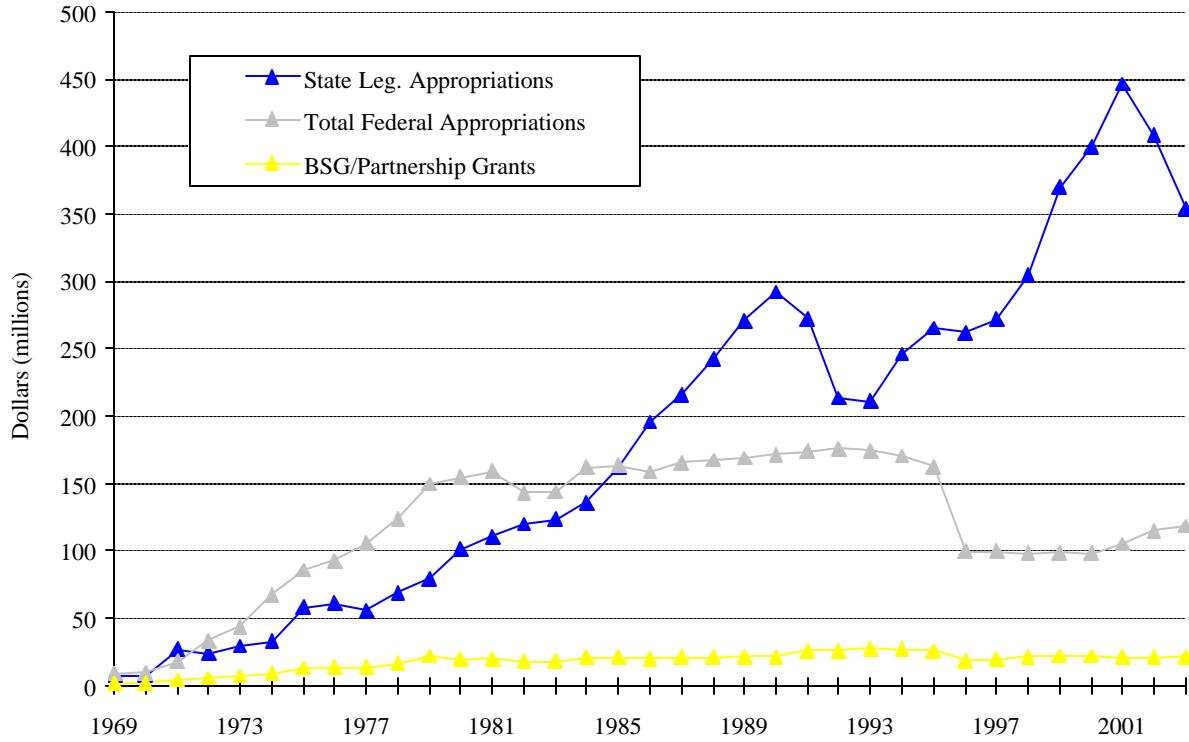

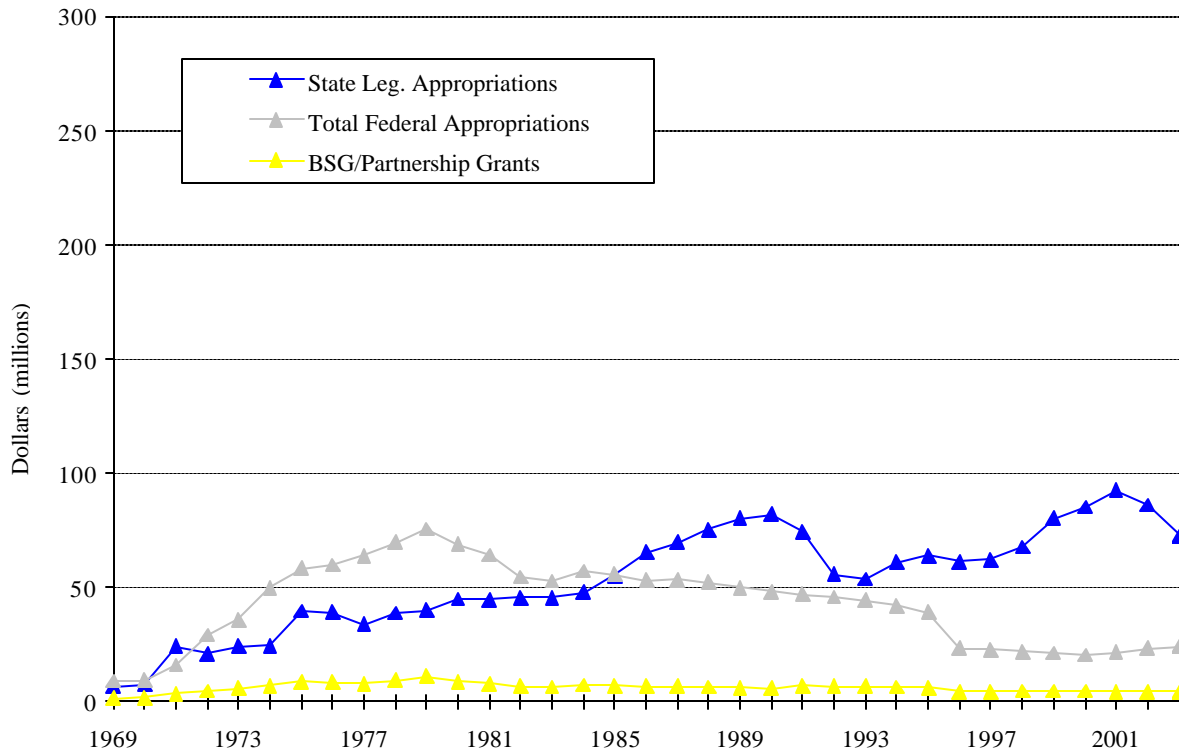

¹ Alabama

Base appropriation dropped 20.1% while line items increased.

² Arkansas

Most of drop reflects line items received in FY01 as part of a biennium budget. Base appropriation dropped 11.2%.

³ California

\$13 million decrease due to elimination of some line items. Base appropriation decreased 30%. California state budget experienced a \$24 billion shortfall. Funds dedicated to education were constitutionally exempt from cuts. All other state agencies required to absorb necessary expenditure reductions.

⁴ Colorado

Appropriation significantly reduced by a gubernatorial line-item veto of funds for Denver-area programs, on top of a 4% government-wide cut.

⁵ Connecticut

Appropriation includes a \$5 million special allocation line item pending confirmation from Office of Policy and Management.

⁶ Florida

Much of decrease due to elimination of line items. Base appropriation dropped 4.2%.

⁷ Iowa

Decrease caused by an 11% across-the-board cut, with an additional targeted 50% cut to grants for festivals and cultural events.

⁸ Massachusetts

The legislature reduced appropriation by 24% and acting governor cut an additional 37.9%. Acting governor cut a total of \$355 million from selected state agencies to cover \$1.9 billion budget deficit.

⁹ Missouri

Drop due to elimination of line items and cultural trust principal payments. Agency was appropriated an additional \$117,336, but funds not available due to governor's withholding.

¹⁰ New York

Agency decrease of .04% not reflected due to rounding.

¹¹ Oregon

State on biennium budget. Anticipated decrease will be reflected in FY04 report.

¹² Puerto Rico

Most of increase due to increase in line items. Base appropriation increased 2.1%

¹³ Tennessee

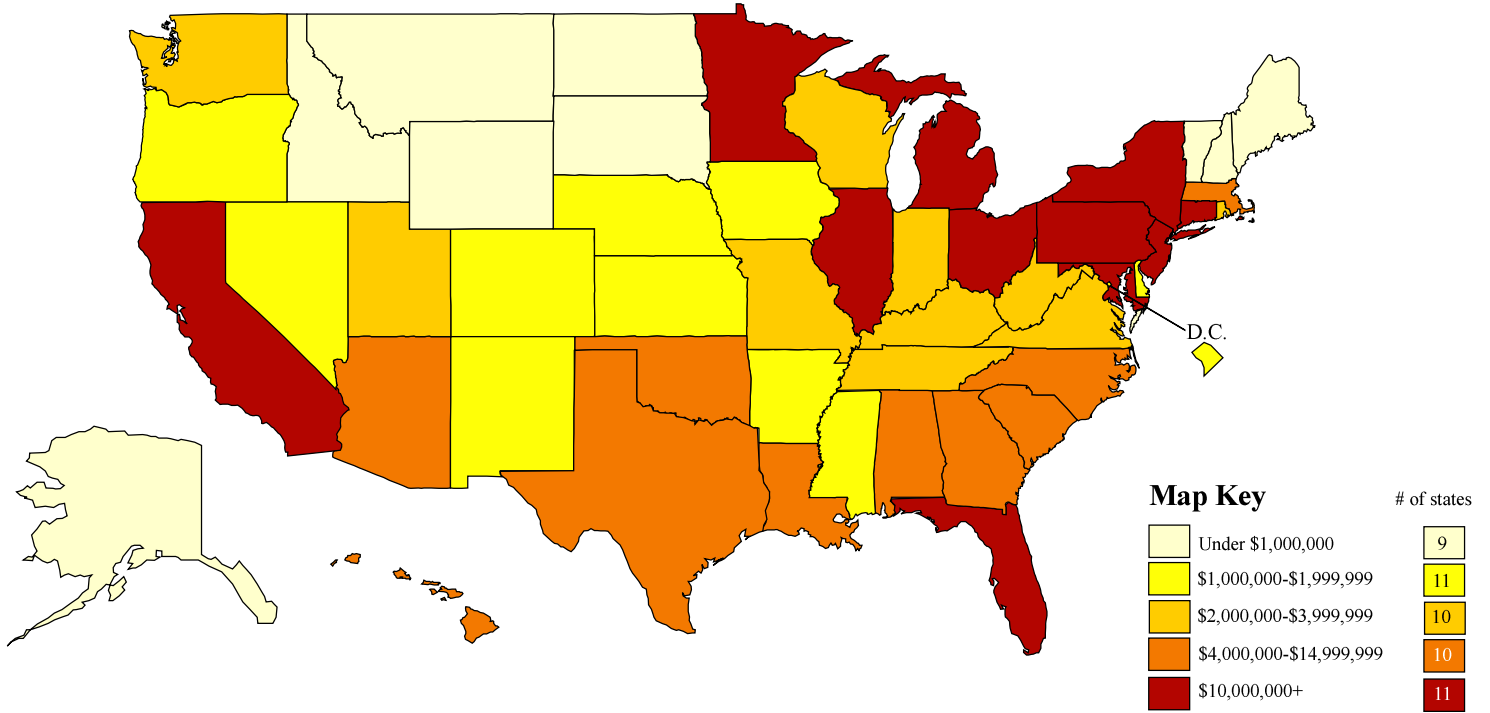
Increase mostly due to increased sales and higher price of specialty license plates, which provide the bulk of grant program funds.

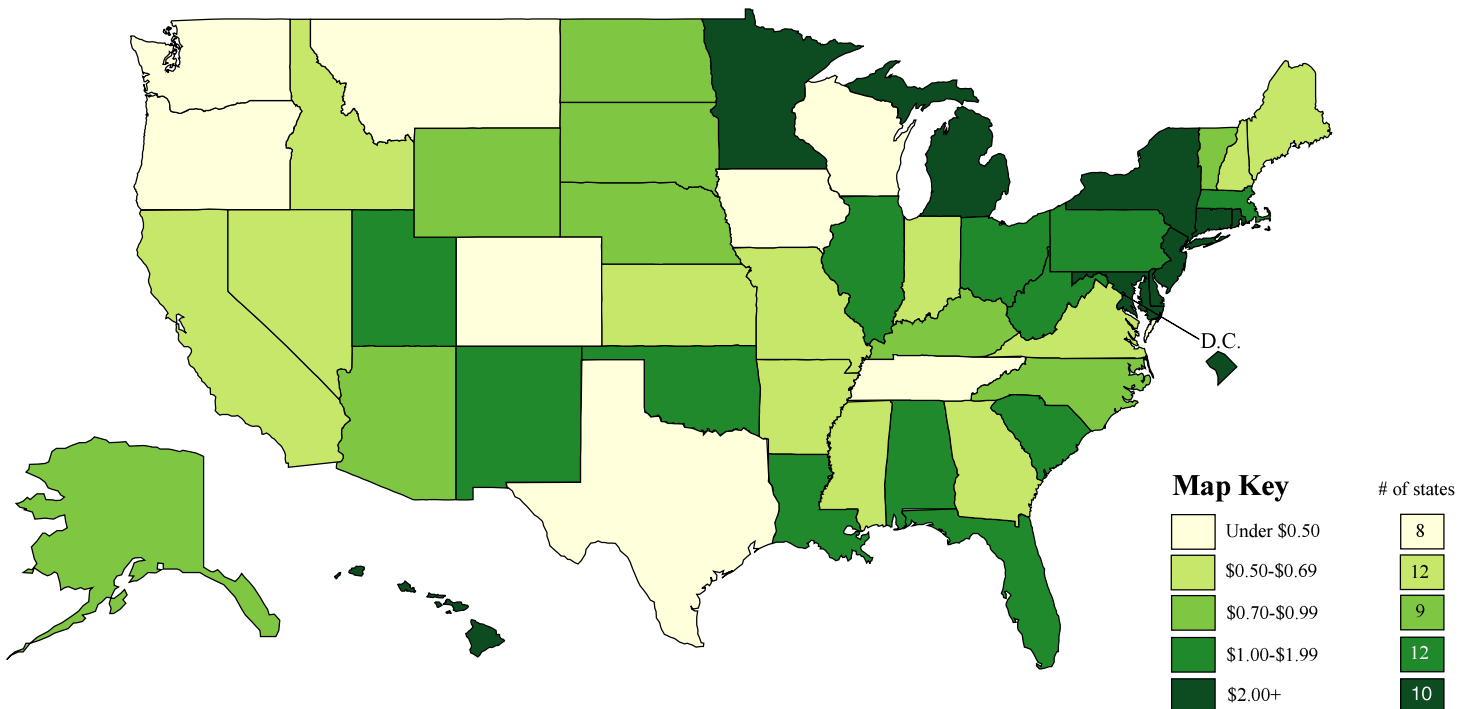

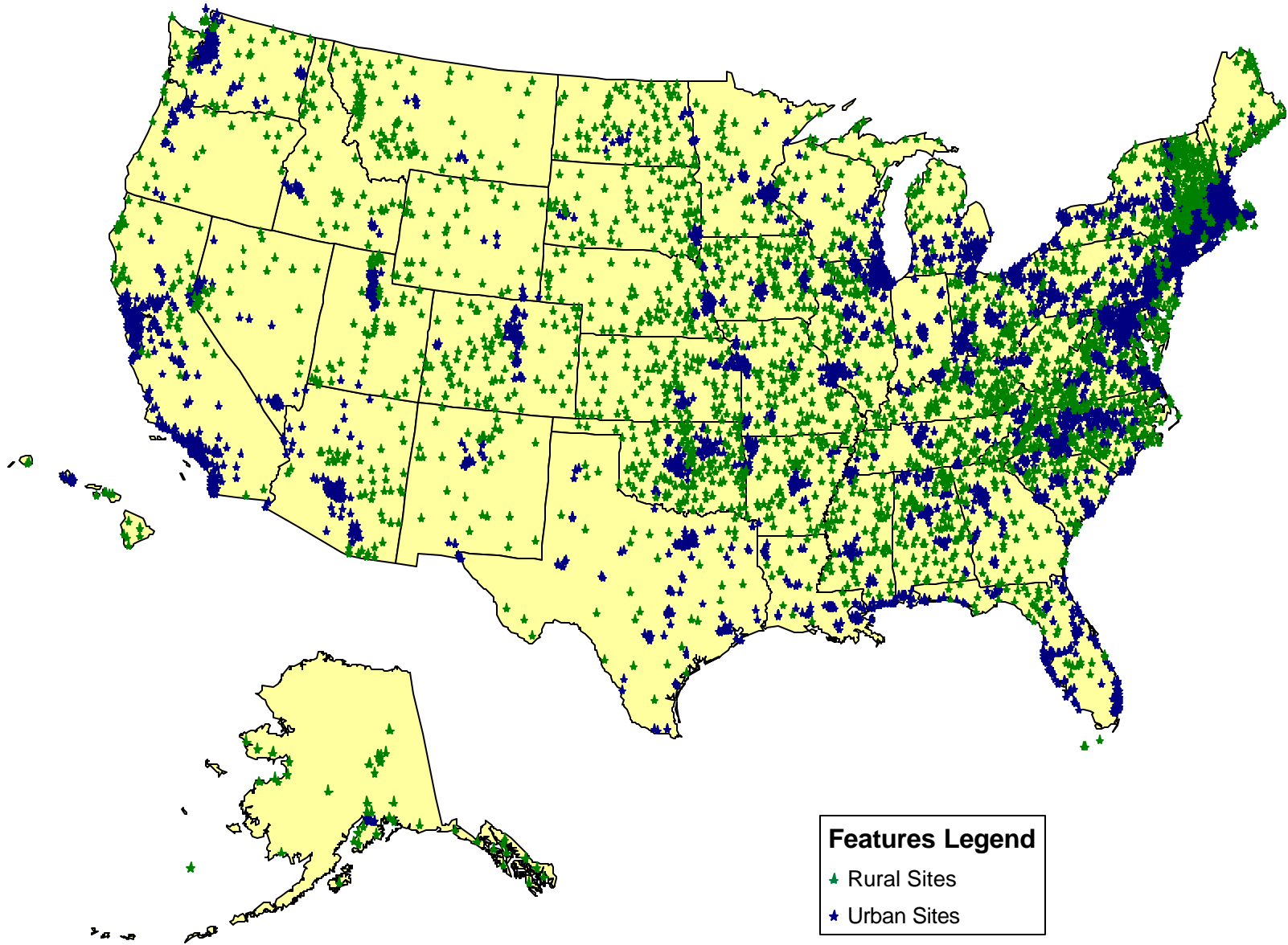

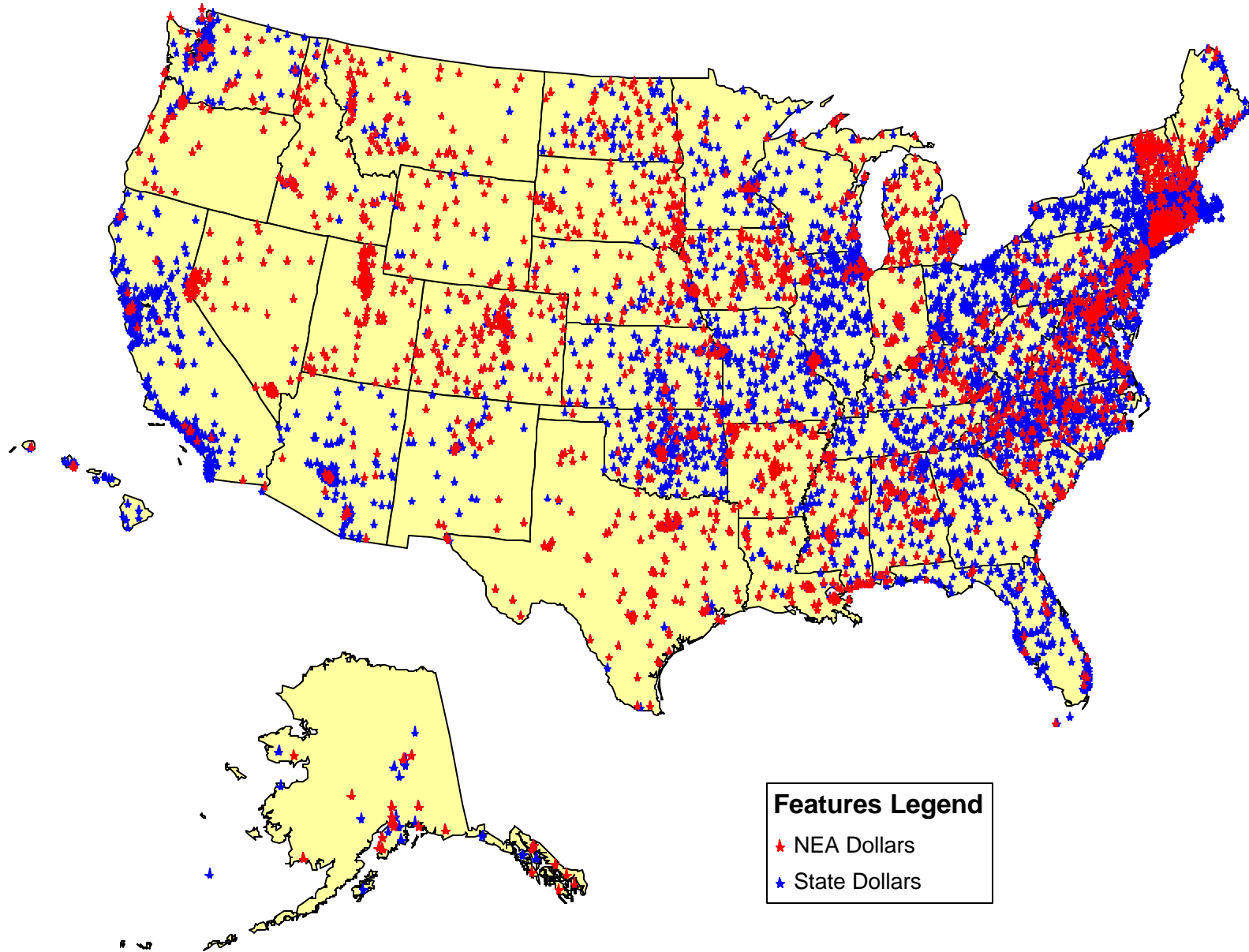
Rural and Urban State Arts Agency Grantee Sites, Fiscal Year 2001

Types of Funds Used for State Arts Agency Grants, Fiscal Year 2001

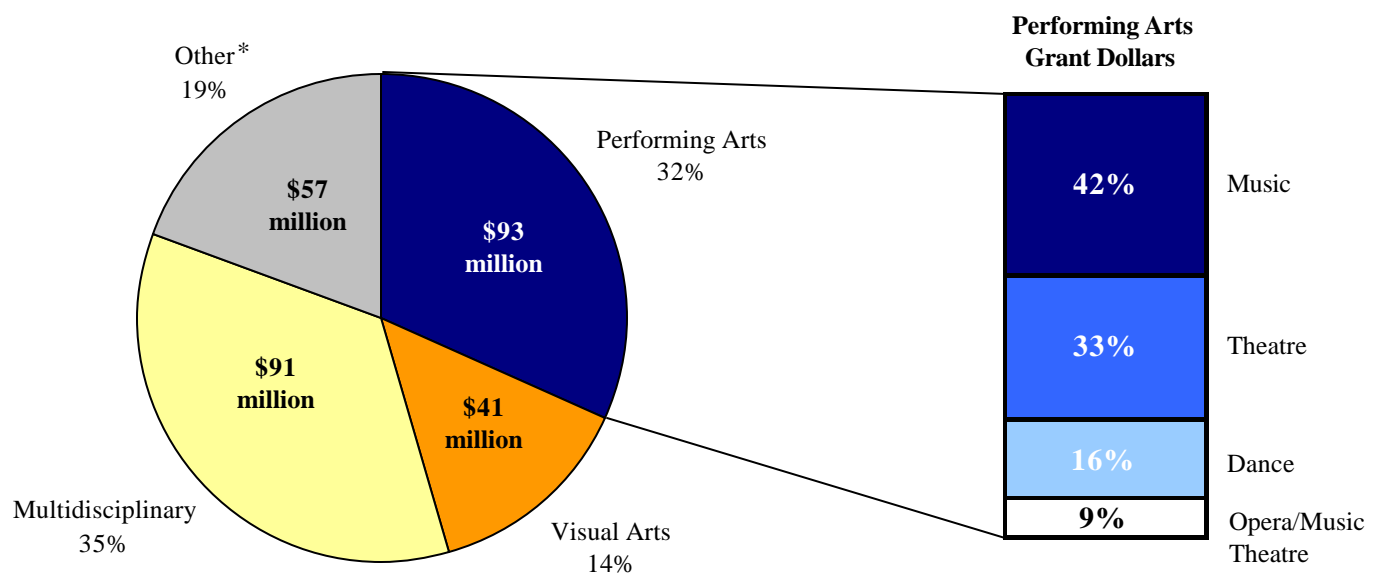

The code Multidisciplinary reflects the involvement of more than one art form through multiple projects (for example: support for a series of exhibits that includes visual arts, photography and media arts). State arts agencies also direct substantial support to some discipline areas, especially Folk Arts and Literature, through technical assistance, information services, and field work. Since they are not grants per se, such services are not captured in grant making data for every state.

Discipline Areas of SAA Grant Dollars, Fiscal Year 2001

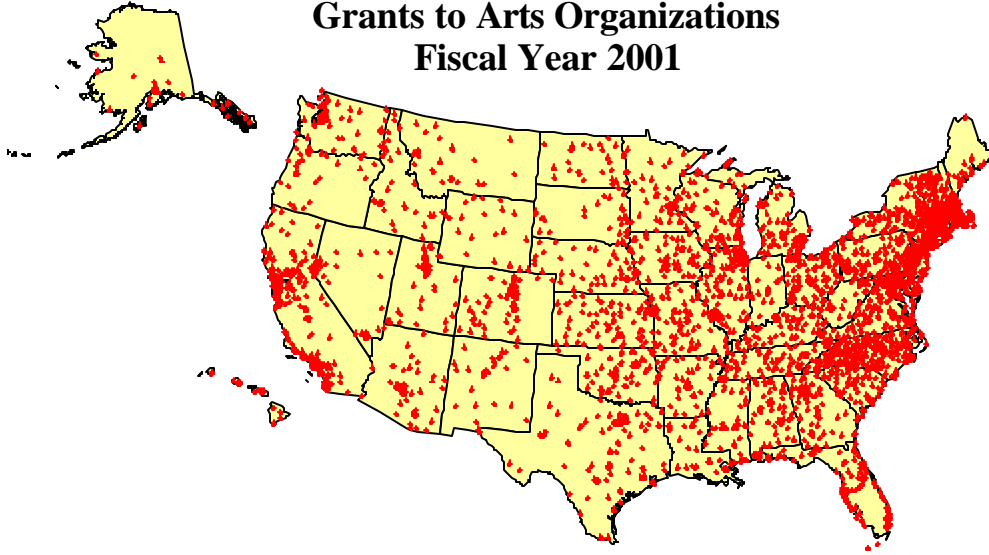

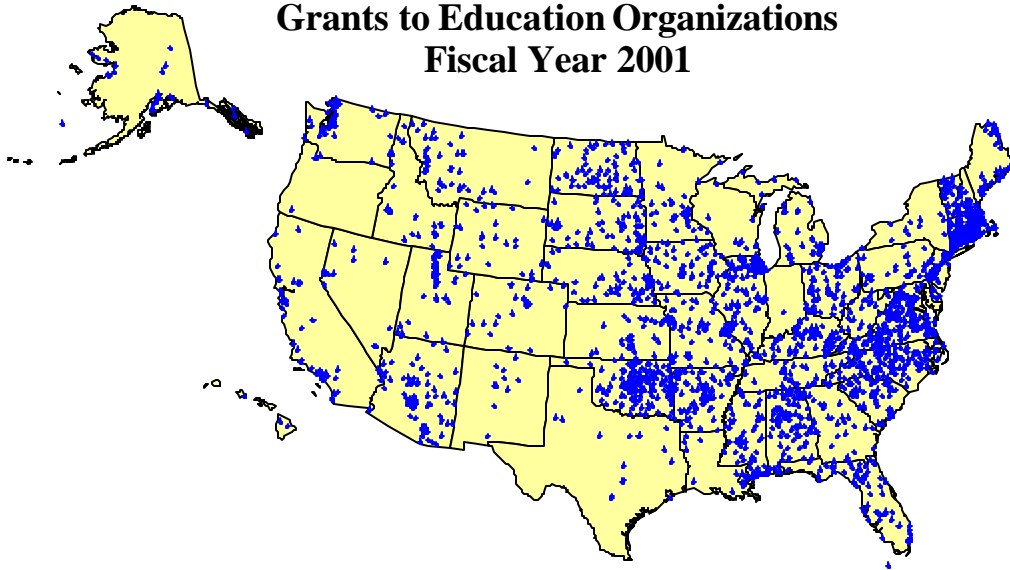

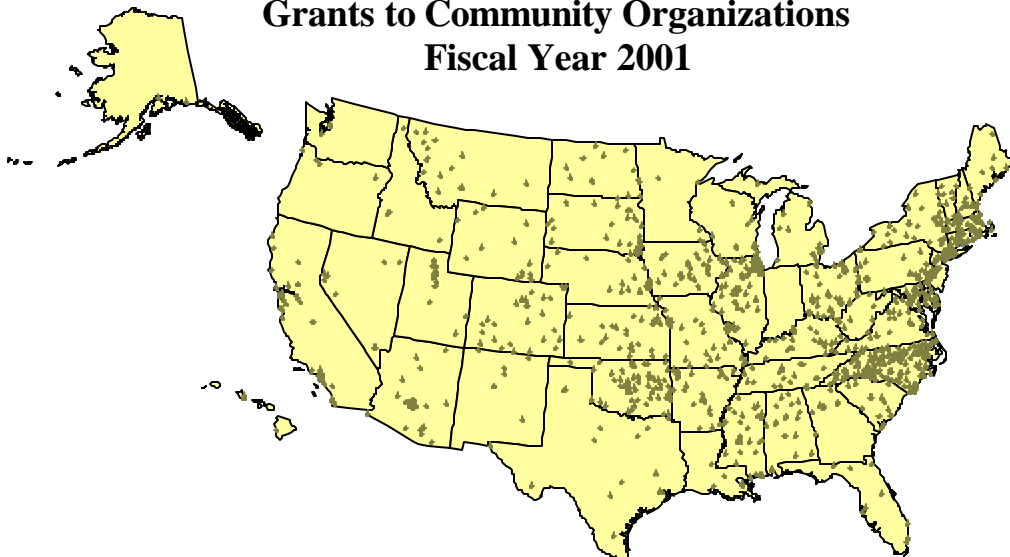
**Grants to Arts Organizations
Fiscal Year 2001**



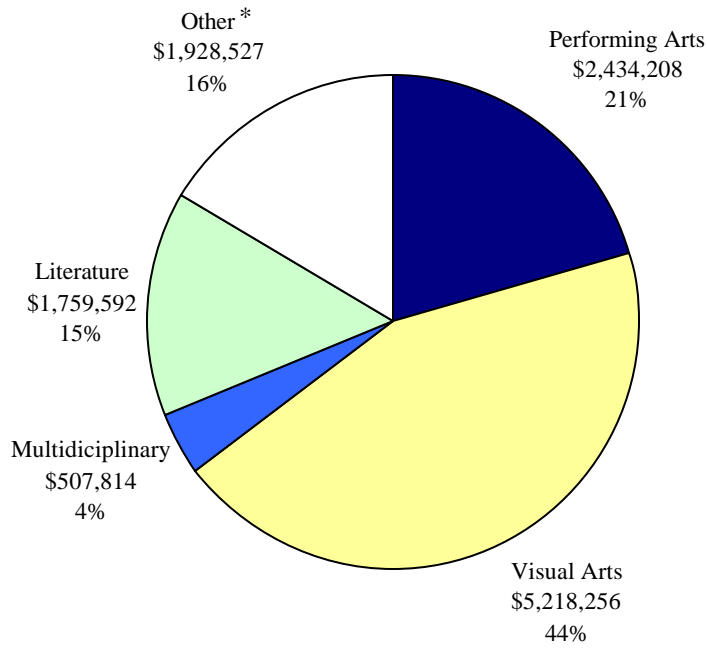
**Grants to Education Organizations

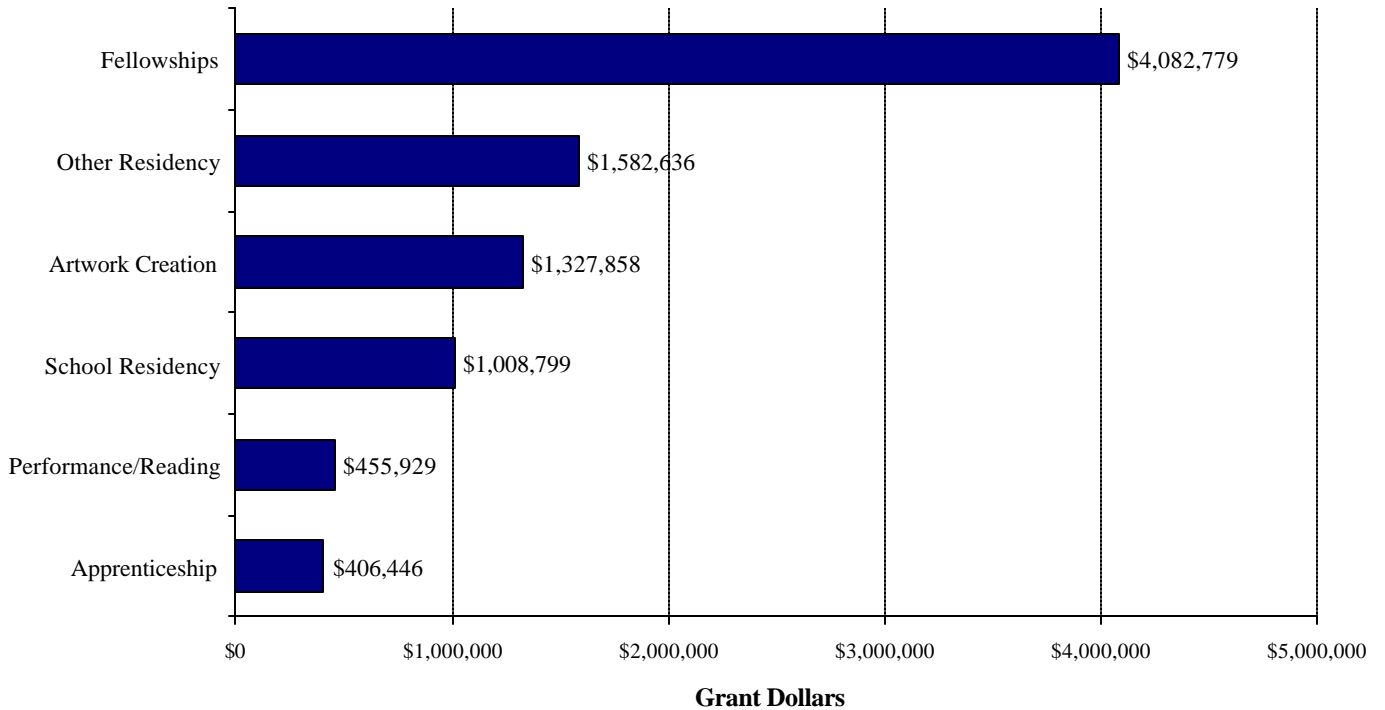


Project Disciplines of Individual Artist Grants, Fiscal Year 2001

Selected Individual Artist Grant Activities, Fiscal Year 2001



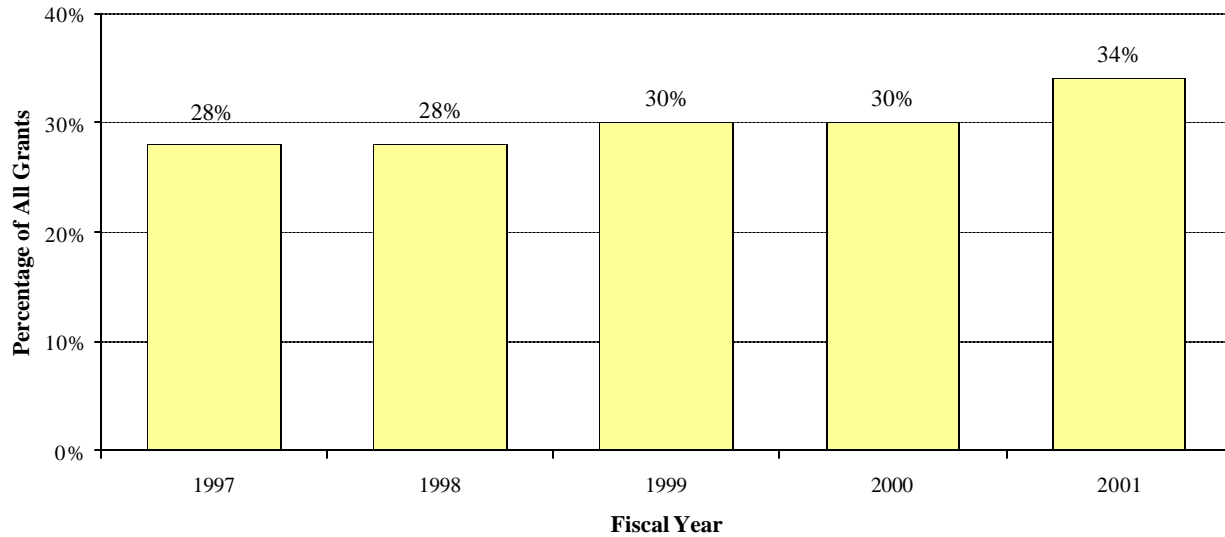

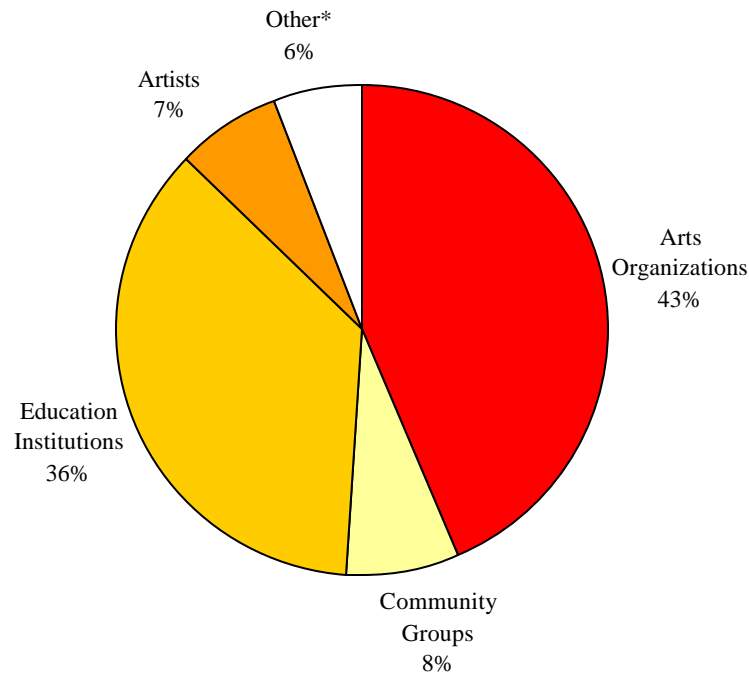

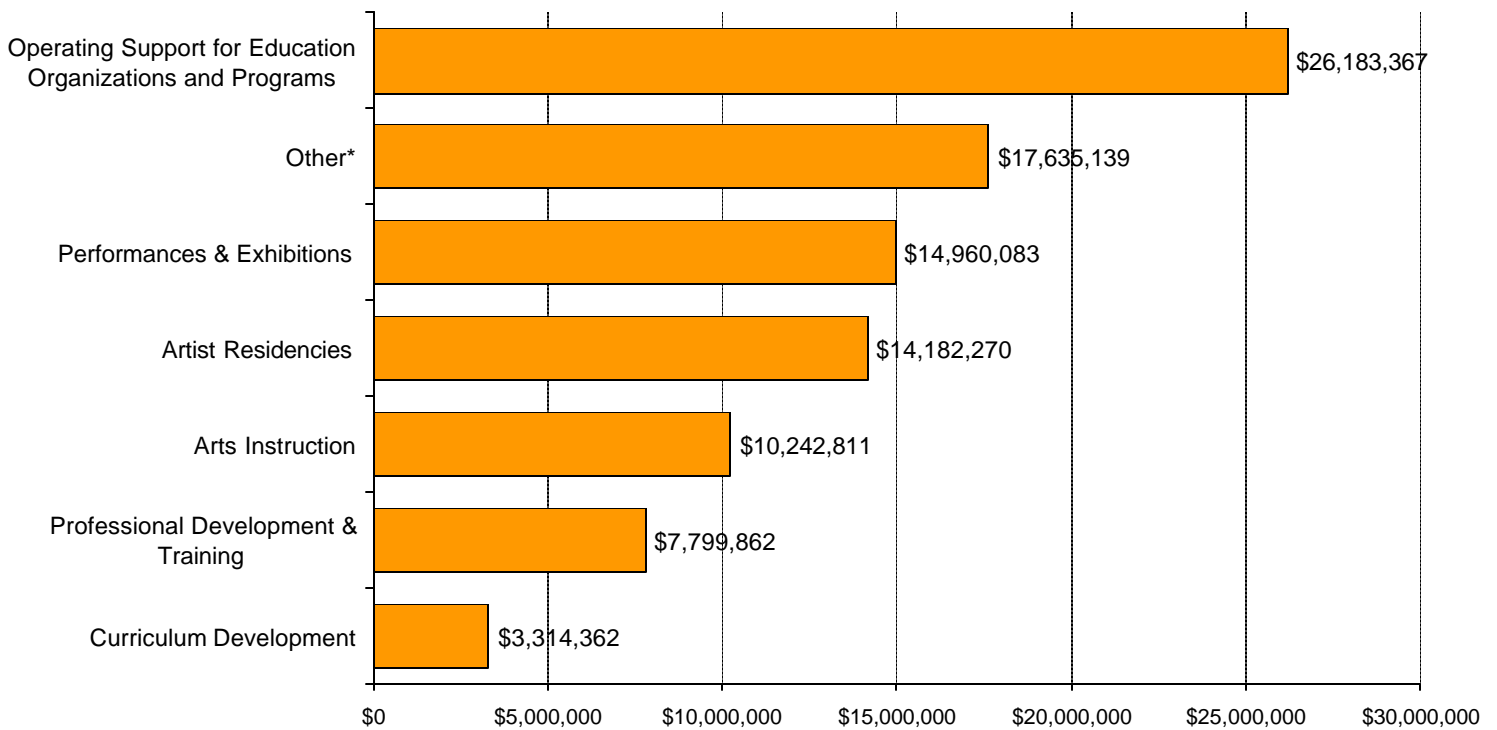

About the Data: Notes and Methodology

Sources of State and Federal Funding Information

All state arts agency appropriations information is drawn from *NASAA's Legislative Appropriations Annual Survey* and *SAA Public Funding Sourcebook* publications. Aggregate appropriations figures include complete legislative funding and line items, where applicable, through state arts agencies. Constant dollar spending figures are calculated using average annual Consumer Price Indices (CPI) figures from the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics. Federal arts appropriations and NEA grant amounts on page 3 are included as reported to NASAA by the National Endowment for the Arts.

Per capita spending information detailed on page 5 of this report is calculated in several ways, depending on the category being considered. These are explained below:

- a) Per capita spending based on total legislative appropriations has been used historically to track state or jurisdictional legislative spending. The per capita figure is calculated by dividing the total legislative appropriation by the U.S. Census population total for that state or jurisdiction.
- b) Per capita spending based on legislative appropriations without line items is calculated by subtracting all line items a state arts agency reports from its legislative appropriations total, and then dividing the remainder by the U.S. Census population total for the state or jurisdiction. Since many states or jurisdictions do not receive any line items, this figure is often equal to the legislative appropriations amount.
- c) Per capita spending based on total SAA revenue is calculated by dividing the sum of all SAA revenue (legislative appropriations, NEA funding, other state funds and miscellaneous funds) by the U.S. Census population total for that state or jurisdiction.

SAA Grant Activities

Information on state arts agency grant making is extracted from annual Final Descriptive Reports (FDRs) submitted to the National Endowment for the Arts and NASAA. This data is prepared by SAAs following the conventions of the National Standard for Arts Information Exchange. Statistics included in these exhibits reflect states' FY 2001 programs. The database used for these exhibits contains nearly 29,000 individual grant or activity records, each comprised of 24 core fields. Analysis is performed on a field-by-field basis, with key characteristics of each record isolated for examination as a unique sub-sample of the overall data set. Therefore, the information in each individual exhibit is unique, and may not be directly comparable to that of other sub-samples.

Page 9: Rural/Urban Status

Grants to rural areas are those which contain a zip code falling outside of a Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) as defined by the Bureau of the Census. Jurisdictions (American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, Northern Marianas and the Virgin Islands) are not MSA-classified by the Census and are therefore excluded from these tables. Additionally, the grant records coded as "rural" in the state of New Jersey reflect New Jersey State Council on the Arts staff designations, not Census Bureau designations, as the Census defines the entire state of New Jersey as "urban."
