Organization Mission Statement

The Wisconsin Arts Board (WAB) is the state agency that nurtures creativity, cultivates expression, promotes the arts, supports the arts in education, stimulates community and economic development, and serves as a resource for people of every culture and heritage.

Arts Education Mission Statement

The goals of the Arts Education program at WAB are to catalyze the statewide effort to establish the arts as core curriculum of grades preK-16 and as a tool to enhance education in other subjects; to assist and support artists working in arts education with grants and service; to provide information and resources to arts education advocates and decision makers; and to advocate for inclusion of a diversity of cultures in arts education curricula.

Arts Education Program Overview

WAB includes arts education in all of its funding programs and priorities. There is an education component in the major granting program, Creation and Presentation, to which arts organizations apply for operational support. This includes both lifelong learning activities appropriate to the community that the applicant serves and K-12 in-school educational programming that meets the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's arts education standards in visual art and design, dance, literature (within the English language arts standards), music and/or theater.

WAB has a dedicated category for arts education in its project grants, the Creative Communities program. The arts education component provides funds to schools and/or community organizations that bring in professional or traditional artists to work with K-12 students. Examples include traditional residencies; short-term artist visits; assembly programs; teacher workshops; after-school or summer school projects; projects that encourage arts organizations and schools to work together to develop necessary and/or innovative programs that enhance the established curricula; and projects that emphasize creativity across the disciplines as elaborated in the Wisconsin Task Force on Arts and Creativity in Education Action Plan.

WAB partners with myriad organizations to support the arts and creativity in education, in schools and out of schools.

WAB is prioritizing outreach and continued activity on the Wisconsin Task Force on Arts and Creativity in Education findings and publications.

Major Initiatives & Partnerships

Wisconsin Task Force for Arts and Creativity in Education

Emerging from WAB's participation in the Education Leadership Institute, the state superintendent of public instruction partnered with Lieutenant Governor Barbara Lawton, WAB's board chair, to convene a Task Force on Arts and Creativity in Education. The Task Force conducted nine public forums and reviewed the status of arts education in Wisconsin and research done by experts in the field. Funding for Arts Education Program from Sources Other Than NEA and State General Fund

Annual Events

Here at Home Cultural Tour

This annual four- to nine-day tour of the local cultures of Wisconsin offers expeditionary learning for teachers, with the arts incorporated across the curriculum.

Professional Development Services

Provision of Professional Development Trainings, Workshops and/or Institutes

- For classroom teachers, professional development is administered by the state arts agency office. Wisconsin Teachers of Local Culture provides an annual four- to nine-day tour of the local cultures of Wisconsin. This is expeditionary learning for teachers with the arts incorporated across the curriculum.
- For arts specialists, professional development is administered by the state arts agency office. Professional development services for arts specialists is included as part of service offerings for all teachers.

Staff Biographies

Anne Pryor has taught in diverse educational settings with learners of all ages and levels. She is project director for the award-winning educational Web site "Wisconsin Folks," cofounder of the statewide organization Wisconsin Teachers of Local Culture, coeditor of "Quilting Circles, Learning Communities," an associate editor for the *Journal of American Folklore*, a past convener of the Folklore and Education Section of the American Folklore Society, and the board president of Local Learning: The National Network for Folk Arts in Education. Pryor holds a Ph.D. in cultural anthropology from the University of Wisconsin, an M.A. in cultural anthropology from Colorado State University, and a B.S. in elementary education from SUNY-Oneonta. Prior to her current position, she served as the folk arts education specialist at WAB.

George Tzougros is a member of the Governor's Council on Tourism, the Cultural Coalition of Wisconsin and the steering committee for the Wisconsin Task Force on Arts and Creativity in Education. He was a member of the Wisconsin team for the National Endowment for the Arts Education Leaders Institute. He is president of Wisconsin/Chiba Incorporated, an advisory board member of the Wisconsin Foundation for the Arts, and a board member of the Wisconsin Alliance for Arts Education, the Robert E. Gard Wisconsin Idea Foundation and Film Wisconsin. Tzougros has served as executive director of the Arts Board since 1996; prior to that he was assistant director of the agency and was responsible for arts education, community development, and presenting and touring.
